Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the Colbert County Commission 4/5/2022

The Colbert County Commission met today in regular session at the Colbert County Courthouse. Chairman Isom called the work session to order at 5:03 p.m. with the regular meeting following at 6:07 p.m., being the time and place previously scheduled for such work session and regular meeting. All Commissioners answered "present" at the call of the roll. Commissioner Mansell offered the prayer and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Isom declared that a quorum was present for the purpose of the transaction of business.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Elaine Nunley with the Caring Place spoke about adult daycare services for adults with dementia or Alzheimer's. They are open from 7:00 A.M – 6:00 P.M. They have long time care and scholarships. The City of Sheffield gave them the building to operate of at 216 Marengo St., Florence. Nunley states that if one utilizes The Caring Place, the need for nursing home care can be postponed by up to 2 years. She is asking a donation of \$5,000.00 or more to help with the 1st year of operations.

Mary Baschab-Haslacker introduced herself to the Commission. She stated that she wanted to let them know that she is qualified for the District Judge position. Her philosophy is that the court belongs to everyone and is equal to them all. She said that she will also be a leader in the community.

PUBLIC HEARING

A RESOLUTION TO INCREASE PAY FOR COLBERT COUNTY ELECTION WORKERS

WHEREAS, election poll workers in Colbert County are currently paid at the rate of \$125.00 per day for inspectors and \$100.00 per day for other workers; and

WHEREAS, the Probate Judge has requested an increase in pay for all election poll workers in Colbert County, and the Colbert County Commission is desirous of increasing said pay.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COLBERT COUNTY COMMISSION that daily pay for all election poll workers in Colbert County be increased by \$25.00 per day per worker.

4. Approved request for pay increase of \$100.00 per month for Mental Health Officer Mike Booth by adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Colbert County Commission currently provides a salary supplement of \$400.00 for a Colbert County Deputy who serves as mental health officer; and

WHEREAS, the provision of a mental health officer has greatly benefited the citizens of Colbert County; and

WHEREAS, the workload of the mental health officer has increased substantially by the relocation of the mental health unit to Shoals Hospital.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COLBERT COUNTY COMMISSION that the salary supplement for the Colbert County Mental Health Officer be increased to \$500.00 per month.

5. Approved Resolution declaring April 2022 as Fair Housing Month, as follows:

A RESOLUTION TO DECLARE THE MONTH OF APRIL 2022 AS FAIR HOUSING MONTH

WHEREAS, the month of April is recognized throughout these United States of America as Fair Housing Month; and

WHEREAS, TITLE VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended, set forth a national policy of fair housing without regard to race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, or disability; and

WHEREAS, the Colbert County Commission continues to affirmatively further fair housing for its citizens.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COLBERT COUNTY COMMISSION, that April 2022 is hereby proclaimed to be Fair Housing Month in Colbert County, Alabama.

A RESOLUTION CONCERNING GRANT FUNDING AT ROSE TRAIL PARK

WHEREAS, Colbert County, Alabama (the "County") proposes to improve recreational resources at Rose Trail Park to provide for the health, well-being, and enjoyment of County residents, and national and international tourists; and

WHEREAS, the County has made application to the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs for grant assistance through the Land and Water Conservation Fund State Assistance Program to make such improvements to the said recreational resources; and

WHEREAS, the total proposed project costs total \$500,000.00. The County is applying for Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance in the amount of \$250,000.00, or 50% of the proposed project costs which will be used to improve recreational and visitor facilities at Rose Trail Park.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COLBERT COUNTY COMMISSION, that Colbert County, Alabama will hold in reserve \$250,000.00, or 50% of the proposed project costs for the purpose of matching the Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the event a grant is awarded, Colbert County, Alabama understands that it will sign assurances to comply with all applicable federal and state laws, rules, and regulations, and that the property acquired and/or developed with Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance will be maintained for public outdoor recreation in perpetuity as required by the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965.

WHEREAS, the Northwest Alabama Council of Local Governments (NACOLG) is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as recipient of Shoals Urbanized Area planning funds for the Shoals Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), and who is responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134 and 135 (amended by the FAST Act, Sections 1201 and 1202, December 2015); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and

WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (Pub. L. 117-58, November 15, 2021, "Bipartisan infrastructure Law," or "BIL") authorized and appropriated \$1.5 billion to be awarded by the Department of Transportation ("DOT") for FY 2022 for Local and Regional Project Assistance Program Grants under National Infrastructure Investments. This Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) solicits applications for projects to be funded under Local and Regional Project Assistance Program, known as the RAISE Grants program, including any additional funding appropriated for the RAISE Grants program under the FY 2022 Appropriations Act; and

WHEREAS, there exists an urgent need for a new railroad overpass in Colbert County in the city of Sheffield that will not only eliminate severe traffic congestion and safety concerns at existing railroad crossings in the cities of Muscle Shoals, Sheffield, and Tuscumbia but also aid in the economic development of the entire region; and

WHEREAS, the affected cities' and county's governments have joined together to assist the Shoals Area Metropolitan Planning Organization in the facilitation of this project; and

WHEREAS, the Shoals Area Metropolitan Planning Organization approved a resolution on March 2, 2022 in support of the Northwest Alabama Council of Local Governments (NACOLG) submitting for a National Infrastructure Investment (i.e., the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant Program) application on behalf of the Shoals Area Metropolitan Planning Organization; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commission of Colbert County that the Commission supports the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Planning Grant application submitted by the Northwest Alabama Council of Local Governments.

Chairman Isom announced that the Commission would hear reports from staff. Upon being recognized by the Chair, the following reports were heard by the Commission:

County Administrator:

Administrator Roger Creekmore reported that a Resolution of support for the MPO RAISE Grant application should be added to the agenda. As discussed in previous meeting, the lap top computers have been ordered and will be paid with the CDBG-CV Grant money. The total cost will be about \$85,000. IT upgrades will be using ARPA funds. The 2nd phase of upgrades to the network and WIFI will cost about \$100,000.00 not the \$200,000.00 as discussed in previous meeting. Creekmore announced Karen Crowe as the new Auburn Extension County Coordinator. She will attend the April 19th Commission meeting to introduce herself. Dale Stanley will be the new PT officer at the Water St. entrance starting pay @ \$10.26 with no benefits. On April 29th, Lance Cabiness will successfully complete the academy and will receive pay in the amount of \$32,170.32 annually. The Payroll department is adjusting pay to James Whitaker and Ryan Green due to paperwork not going through the proper channels. The American Legion has 3 available spaces in its building. The Commission may possibly occupy all three spaces fronting Main Street. The cost to occupy will be about \$800.00/ month with utilities being approximately \$4000.00/year split with the City of Tuscumbia. Creekmore and the Mayor suggested that if the City and the County proceed with the plan to open a Museum / Archives, a non-profit, governing board consisting of members appointed by the Commission and the City Council to govern the operation.

Chief Financial Officer:

CFO April Eaton reported that a new account had to be opened for ARPA Revenue Replacement Funds. She also reported that she will have the financial report @ the next Commission meeting and that the premium pay payment will be ready on April 15th.

County Attorney:

EMA Director:

Mr. Jody Hitt reported that the NOAA weather radio giveaway and storm spotter training will be April 21, 2022. The giveaway will be 4 P.M. to 6 P.M. and the storm spotter training will be 6 P.M. to 8 P.M. at the Alabama Music Hall of Fame Banquet Hall. Concerning the mitigation grant match adjustments funding from disasters that occurred from 2020-2021, federal match will be 90%, leaving 10% for local. This affects these projects; DR4546 which is the Muscle Shoals Community Storm Shelter and DR4503 which are new EMA and Road Dept. generators and Hurricane Glass in the New EMA building. Updates for project DR4503 - generator request for new Jail/Justice Center determined ineligible. They are unable to obtain historical damage and power outage data for the Reservation, therefore unable to complete a BCA. We will move application to be a %% initiative project where the State decides who receives the awards rather than the Federal. Pertaining to Legislative updates, House Bill 3 (HB3) classifies EMA has Public Safety signed by Governor Ivey and will go into effect on June 1st. HB414 classifies public safety telecommunicators as first responders and sets minimum training standards statewide set to be voted on in Senate today.

County Engineer:

Assistant Engineer Charles King reported that the winter mowing is finishing up and they are stating on spring mowing. He also reported that the water meter instillation started yesterday.
