The Colbert County Commission met today in regular session at the Colbert County Courthouse. Chairman Isom called the work session to order at 5:00 p.m. with the regular meeting following at 5:35 p.m., being the time and place previously scheduled for such work session and regular meeting. All Commissioners answered "present" at the call of the roll with the exception of Commissioner Gardiner who was absent. Commissioner Mansell offered the prayer and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Isom declared that a quorum was present for the purpose of the transaction of business.

CONSENT AGENDA

Chairman Isom announced that the business before the Commission was the approval of the consent agenda. Commissioner Mansell made motion to adopt and approve the matters placed on the consent agenda during the work session. The motion was duly seconded by Commissioner Bailey. Chairman Isom stated that the adoption and approval of a consent agenda comprised of the following items of business was properly before the Commission and stated the matters as follows:

RESOLUTION NUMBER 2023-0001

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING AND COMMITING TO REQUIRED PARTICIPATION IN THE ALABAMA RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM WHEREAS, the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs ("ADECA") has informed the Colbert County Commission on the selection of the Alloys Park Campground Expansion for participation in ADECA's Recreational Trails Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is desirous of participating in the grant program to complete the project.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COLBERT COUNTY COMMISSION, that the Commission hereby accepts financial assistance from ADECA through its Recreational Trails Program Project 22-RT-55-01, Alloys Park Campground Expansion in the amount of \$244,952.45.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Commission hereby commits itself to provide the required matching share of \$250,000.00 or 50.51% of the total project cost, as required by the terms of the grant.

7. Approved Speed Limit Posting on McCormack Lane at 35 mph by adoption of the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION NUMBER 2023-0002

A RESOLUTION SETTING THE MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE SPEED FOR MCCORMACK LANE

WHEREAS, the Colbert County Commission, pursuant to *Ala. Code* § 23-1-80, et seq. (1975, as amended), is charged with the general superintendence of the public roads, bridges, and ferries within Colbert County so as to render travel over the same as safe and convenient as practicable; and

WHEREAS, McCormack Lane, being part of the county road maintenance program, is located in Sections 35 and 36, Township 4 South, Range 10 West; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the County Engineer, based upon population, horizontal and vertical curves, passing and stopping distances, shoulder and pavement widths, and/or sight distances specific to the said roads, that the maximum allowable speed for McCormack Lane be set at 35 miles per hour.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COLBERT COUNTY COMMISSION that the posted maximum allowable speed for McCormack Lane, a Colbert County Road located in Sections 35 and 36, Township 4 South, Range 10 West, be and is hereby is set at 35 miles per hour.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Colbert County Road Department, under the superintendence of the County Engineer, or his designee, be and hereby is authorized and directed to post signs setting the maximum allowable speed at 35 miles per hour along the rights of way of McCormack Lane, in such places and in such manner is he deems to be in the best interests of the citizens of Colbert County, Alabama.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 2023-0003

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF AMENDMENTS 2 AND 7 TO THE ALABAMA CONSTITUTION **WHEREAS,** the Colbert County, Alabama, County Commission stands in favor of Amendment 2 and Amendment 7 to the Alabama Constitution, which will promote broadband expansion and economic development, respectively.

WHEREAS, citizens across the state are urged to vote "Yes" on Amendment 2 and Amendment 7 on Election Day, November 8, 2022.

WHEREAS, Amendment 2 would authorize state and local governments to use certain public funds to incentivize broadband expansion, most notably in the rural and underserved areas of the state.

WHEREAS, Amendment 7 makes several necessary technical changes to local governments' economic development powers-the most important of which is clarifying that all counties may exercise these powers, regardless of whether they also have a local constitutional amendment pertaining to economic development.

WHEREAS, Amendment 2 and Amendment 7 will each greatly benefit this county and state by prioritizing broadband expansion and economic development as we progress further into an era in which economic and technological stability are critical.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COLBERT COUNTY COMMISSION that it expresses its resolute support of Amendments 2 and 7 to the Alabama Constitution and any other legislation or policy modeled similarly.
