Colbert County Commission met today in regular session at the Colbert County Courthouse. Commissioner Gardiner called the meeting to order at 7:11 p.m. Chairman Jimmar was not present at the meeting. All other Commissioners were in attendance. Commissioner Black offered the invocation.

CONSENT AGENDA

1. Approved minutes from February 7, 2017 Commissioner meeting.
2. Approved payment of bills as presented.
3. Approved to pay one-half of an hourly rate of 12.50 for School Resource Officers salaries and Colbert County Board of Education to pay other half of salaries, while Board of Education seeks grants available for this purpose. County will not be obligated, if Board of Education receives grant funds.
4. Authorized Mike Melton to check on a maintenance service agreement for the generator located at the Annex Building. The generator is located over the Jail.
5. Approved appointment of Mr. Ernest Darby to the Community Action Agency of Northwest Alabama, Inc. This appointment was made by Commissioner Gardiner.
6. Approved pay increase for four Courthouse Maintenance employees. The salaries will be increased to: Scott Dawsey \$11.35/hour, Brian Arnold \$11.59/hour, Heath Armstrong \$16.10/hour, Robby Carter \$23.50/hour.
7. Approved transfer of liquor license for Retail Beer (Off Premises Only) for White Oak Market located at 4395 West Highway 157, Leighton, AL 35645. The applicant for the liquor license is Samu Inc.
8. Approved Resolution supporting a three-cent bond issue to generate funds for Alabama Counties to be spent on road and bridge improvements and is proposed by the Association of County Commissions of Alabama.
9. Approved promotion of Kellie Clark to position of Appraiser-Trainee (Personal Property) grade 7 step 1 and transfer requested by Regina Fort

to Property Valuation Analyst Grade 5. These changes were requested by Revenue Commissioner Tommy Oswalt.

10. Approved change in job description for position of Assistant Motor Vehicle Supervisor to grade 7 and promotion of Jennifer Harbin to this position as requested by Probate Judge Daniel Rosser.
11. Approved purchase of Ad for Recall Lagrange/Program Book from the LaGrange Living Historical Association in the amount of \$175.00.
12. Approved appointment of Mrs. Judy Armstrong to another term on the Colbert County DHR Board of Directors.
13. Approved salary increase in the amount of \$500.00 per year for Jessie McKinney. This salary increase was recommended by Sheriff Williamson upon Deputy McKinney's receiving his Bachelor of Science degree.

16. Approved ADA voting machine maintenance agreement to begin 2018 unless there is a special election to be held.

Dr. Gail Satchel, Colbert County Board of Education Superintendent, addressed the Commission to present changes in the County School System's logo and Technical division. A power point presentation was led by Matt Osborn, to show new and improved programs offered through the County School System. Dr. Satchel invited the Commission to partner with County School System for updated social media services. Dr. Satchel requested the Commissioner consider selling the property behind the Board of Education Central Office to the

Board of Education. This would be used for construction of storm shelter and storage building to be used by Central Office.
