

## Debris Fact sheet for 11/29-30/16 Storms

- Do not Burn Debris (the State is still under a burn ban order)
- Debris removal from Right-of-Ways (ROW) is typically under local government legal authority and responsibility
- Ask citizens to segregate debris by type if possible.
- Disposal and Reduction of Debris
  - Vegetative (Non-treated):
    - Debris may be reduced at a reduction site and disposed of at a landfill.
    - Debris may be reduced at a landfill and applied as cover.
    - Debris on ROWs can be chipped and blown onto the ROW where applicable
    - Local government may use a Debris Management Site to reduce debris and a different site for disposal.
    - Reduced debris may be used for cogeneration
    - Reduced debris may be offered to the public as mulch
  - C&D:
    - Must be disposed of in a C&D Certified landfill. This method is preferred.
    - Local government may use a Debris Management Site to sort or store debris and a C&D Certified landfill for disposal.
  - White Goods:
    - Refrigerant must be removed from appliance by a licensed technician.
    - Dispose of by recycling if economically feasible
    - Dispose of at Certified Landfill
  - Electronic Waste:
    - Dispose of at Certified Landfill
  - Household Hazardous Waste:
    - Instruct individuals to take to a Certified landfill
    - Provide a lined area to segregate HHW by type and dispose of at Certified landfill
  - Hazardous Waste:
    - Call ADEM
